

She was a widow for many years. 1946-1971.

She made alot of quilts. She made dresses for me and my cousins.

We always ate at her home for Thanksgiving. She made the best carrot pudding ever. I remember one year for Christmas she bought Andre, Keith and Gehrig shirts. They loved them. She had a strong work ethic.

When grandpa (Jerry) and I were married she hosted a wedding lucheon at her home. A BIG turkey dinner. Bless her heart. She loved grandpa (Jerry) because he was a Republican. She had 7 children. She lost one right after birth.

We couldn't attend her funeral. She died Oct. 27, 1971 and we lived in Star Valley, Wyoming. That October the snow was already deep so we couldn't leave the valley. I had Wells one week later. Sadie Lynn Isom was also named after her.

I could fill up this book with alot more stories of her.

Rudolph Balzly.

My mother's father came from Switzerland with his mother when he was young. He never knew his father as far as I know. He married Anna Elizabeth Houser and they had 12 children. My mom was the youngest of their 12.

He was helping hauling wood from the mountains and a wagon ran over his leg when he tried to fix one of the wheels. He always walked with a crutch or cane. He had a mustache and always chewed tobacco. I was disqusted when I had to kiss him because there was awful tobacco chew on this mouth and whiskers. He died when I was about 10.

Anna Elizabeht Houser Balzly came from Berne, Switzerland with her younger brother when she was 8 or 9. Her brother was about 4 or 5. She was an amazing women. When coming from Switzerland by boat they had to stay down in the bottom where the luggage was kept.

She birthed 12 children. She wasn't any bigger than 5 '2. She worked HARD all her life. Turned no one away from her home. Fed so many people. Made delecious homemade bread and noodles, pies and soups. I could really tell alot about her because she was incredibe. She taught my mom and all of her children how to serve others.

She had many friends. I remember she would sit at her kitchen table and let me fix her hair. I would comb her hair, using alot of water and then put it up with alot of bobbie pins. She never complained, never. She worked as a young girl, just new to this country, in Salt Lake City as a nannie, Washing clothes, cooking, etc. Grandma Annie sang with the Tabernacle Choir.

She died at her home of cancer when I was about 11 or 12. She was loved by all and oh so trecious Mu mon learned service and loving and caring for all from her

mom, Anna Elizabeth.

My dad was born July 6, 1919 in Spanish Fork, utah. His parents were Thomas Bona and Sadie Viola Wilson Bona. My dad was a laborer. He worked various jobs. He worked hard. We had a few acres to work. My dad loved horses and when I was young he did some rodeos. He worked with roping calves.

My dad was the second oldest in his family. He had 4 brothers and 2 sisters. He was always the favorite uncle. Everyone loved uncle Keith. My dad did not go to church but he was an honest man. Loved serving others. One of my favorite memories was when I turned 5. For my birthday present he gave me a really pretty silk night gown. I will never forget that.

unfortunately my father was an alcholic. Which brought much sadness to our home in many different ways. I thank God for the atonement. He was a tender, gentle, man otherwise. He didn't speak very often but when he did he usually taught good lessons.

He enjoyed dancing. His favorite flower was a daisy.

Phyllis Barbara Balzly Bona was my mother. She was born October 23, 1919 the 12th child of Rudalph Balzly and Anna Elizabeth Houser. She grew up in Benjamin, Utah. My mother was taught by her mother of service. My mother's name was always synonomous with service and charity. Mom loved to sing. She had a song for everything. She was a very good cook, it was very seldom she ever she used a recipe. Her fried chicken was superb. SINKERS were wonderful.

Every summer she would buy 100 baby chicks, feed them and by the time fall came we butchered them and had chickens to eat in our freezer. She was active in the church. Saw to it that we went every Sunday. When we were younger our primary was on wednesdays after school. At one of our school plays she made me an outfit with bows and buttons on it. I sang a song the title was, "Buttons and Bows".

For Chistmas one year when I was a tennager she bought me a very nice outfit of stretch pants and a top. We were very poor and I am not sure where she got that much money. I cherished my Madam Alexander doll she gave me one year. Mom taught me how to say my prayers. She also taught me to be a Christian. When I would not be getting along with friends or siblings mom always said, "You be the christian".

When I was in nursing school she got up every morning at 5 a.m. and fixed my breakfast (always cream of wheat) and my lunch to take to school. (usually

always a cheese sandwich) Bless her heart. Then at ngiht she fixed a big supper. She always made us breakfast and supper but when I was in nursing school she was up at 5 a.m. ALWAYS!!!

Mom had a hard time. Her life was not an easy one. She worked hard. My mom had a testimony of Christ. Mom was a good housekeeper. Mom had such a gentle touch. Always rubbed our feet with mentholatum. Tummy ache, tooth ache, we got rubbed. It was when I became an adult I relaized it was "her touch" that healed.

his friends would give him their shoes and then he would have a shoe sale in our basement.


